December 1, 2022

I can vividly remember a conversation between my 13-year-old adolescent self and my mother on the way to church one wintry morning. I asked her, "Mom, what if I don't want to be a Christian?" (a protest undoubtedly influenced by my teenage desire to sleep in).

Fortunately, my mother didn't take the bait. Instead, she told me how the story of God changed her life. She told me how she couldn't imagine her world without the church. She told me how she deeply believed in a better day, and how she felt called to be a part of that.

From the back seat of the car, I could tell that she

was serious. Her joy, her hope, her conviction—they were so pure and authentic they left a lasting impression on me. It was a "generation to generation" moment.

The Christmas story, of a love that came here, walked among us, that was born in a humble manger to uncertain parents with shepherds nearby, is one we pass from generation to generation, because it continues to change us. It reframes the way we hope, centers the way we love and shapes the way we live.

A line from Mary's song tells us: Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name. His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation. (Luke 1:48b-50)

Despite the challenges and vulnerabilities she faced, Mary glimpsed the scale and scope of the good news she was helping bring forth. This good news transcends time and space—it was and is bigger than just her. *Christ is coming: God's redemption is at work for years to come.*

This promise is meant to be lived out and passed on from generation to generation. What are we being called to generate or bring forth? What have your ancestors and those who have come before you passed on to you? Who are the spiritual elders in our community who planted the seeds for the things that are now blooming? What seeds are you planting for the future?

Our lives, histories, actions, and stories are interconnected and woven together. The work of God is always unfolding— in and through us. In the midst of all that is designed to divide us, what does it look like to practice belonging to one another? This Advent season, how will we carry it forth?

You are invited to come and be a part of the story that has spread like wildfire from generation to generation. Let us remember the generations from Abraham to Jesus who waited for that promised day. And let our generation be so influenced in joy and love that future ones can't help but pay attention. This Advent, let us tell the story of good news—from generation to generation. *Peace to you and yours, Pastor Jenn*

About the Art: Genealogy of Christ, by Rev. Lauren Wright Pittman

Inspired by Matthew 1:1-17 "In this image, I chose to represent Christ using a rose at the center of the composition. The women mentioned in the genealogy are imaged as foundational leaves building and upholding Christ. In the bottom left, Tamar holds her father-in-law's insignia, which represents how she assumes his role as the leader of the tribe of Judah and continues its lineage. Moving counterclockwise, Rahab holds the red cord which she lowered to ensure the safety of her family after supplying Israelite spies enough information to achieve victory in Jericho. Next, Ruth holds the wheat that she gleaned from the field. She knows that she must marry again in order to be protected, and so she takes initiative with Boaz. Bathesheba's name isn't even mentioned in Christ's genealogy; she is referred to as the "wife of Uriah." She withstands abuse from King David, survives the murder of her husband, and ensures that her son Solomon takes the throne. Finally, there is Mary who looks adoringly at the rose which represents her son. Here she holds the love and pride of a beautiful lineage that leads to the birth of her son, the Messiah."



hospitality at the reception (lots of work!), and welcoming and ushering guests into the meeting house. Many visitors told us they were moved by the earnest welcome and genuine enthusiasm they found at MCC. Thank you all for being present to celebrate and help transform this sorrow into joy.

Dear MCC Member:

As you may recall from the January 2022 annual meeting or from a subsequent Steeple article, a small group of us have been working on the MCC Constitution. The constitution revision team is Michelle Cardentey, Paster Jenn Gingras, Jessica Pfalzgraf, Gary Thompson and Arlene Redmond.

We had noticed quite a few discrepancies between what say we do and what we were actually doing; also, we wanted to simplify the language. The attached 2023 Proposed MCC Constitution is for your consideration and input. We will have a **congregational meeting** after worship on **January 8th** to get your input. We will vote on the final on **January 29, 2023** at the **Annual Meeting**.

As part of our process, we checked in with some of you on practices. Also, the chairs of the five boards have reviewed it and given input. The five major boards are Deacons, Trustees, Outreach, Christian Education and Fellowship.

We decided to reinstate an earlier practice at MCC where we had bylaws to get into the nitty gritty procedural matters in addition to a broader, more stable constitution that is more foundational, as per the quote below from the UCC website.

From the United Church of Christ Website:

"Churches find it helpful regularly and systematically to review and revise their constitution and bylaws to conform to and complement the mission strategy, size, abilities and commitments of the present congregation... Most churches have a constitution that states the mission and general governing rules. The bylaws, which often are more easily amended, have more specifics."

This proposed constitution is a new constitution as it is the result of a major revision. It will replace the 2017 version. The proposed 2023 MCC Constitution**:

- 1. Is friendlier.
- 2. Uses language that is updated, modernized, and clear.
- 3. Is easier to read.
- 4. Is understandable to a modern audience.
- 5. Is simpler.
- 6. Better reflects current practices.

In addition:

7. A lot of the "guts" have been moved to Bylaws which are "*subordinate rules* adopted by the church to augment the Constitution." The Constitution "*is the broader* body of mutually agreed upon principles and purposeful structure that govern the affairs and action of the church" (from the UCC website).

8. Discrepancies between what we really do vs. what the Constitution says we do have been eliminated or narrowed.

9. Amendments have been *incorporated* into the new revised version, as per Article XIII (2023). If this constitution (2023) is amended prior to the next major revision, an amendment would be listed at the end until it could be incorporated.

Numbers 1 through 9 above are the reasons we undertook this revision: to eliminate discrepancies between what we do and what the Constitution says, to make it more readable, to make it more relevant and unified as a document.

What is **not** changed:

- 1. Underlying faith.
- 2. Our Covenant (UCC Statement of Faith is not ours to change).
- 3. Articles and Sections.
- 4. Purpose.
- 5. Intent.
- 6. Principles.

- 7. General practices.
- 8. Church structure.

Copies of the proposed constitution, proposed bylaws, and the current constitution, have been previously emailed for reference. You can also get a copy from the information rack outside of the church office. Please review and let us know your input.

Elisha's Corner By Gary Thompson, Church Historian Dedication of This Olde House – 1847

This has been a year for anniversaries. The fifteenth anniversary of Pastor Jenn's pastorate at MCC; the fiftieth anniversary of the modern day Strawberry Festival; the one hundredth anniversary of our incorporation as the Monroe Congregational Church, thus dissolving the Ecclesiastical Society; and the one hundred fiftieth anniversary of the purchase of the Monroe Centre Green with St. Peter's Episcopal Church. Now there is just one more. One hundred seventy-five years ago on Wednesday, December 15, 1847, our current Meeting House (less its expansion) was formally dedicated. The following was transcribed from the New Stratford Ecclesiastical Society Book of Records regarding the building and the dedication of our current Meeting House:

Miscellaneous Notices

Transferred from page 273 by Rev. Robert Dexter Gardner, June 28, 1847.

The Presbyterian or Congregational Meetinghouse in this town was raised June

21 & 22, 1769.

In 1824 the Meeting house was new roofed.

In 1826 the Meeting house was covered anew by donations received through the hands of Rev. Chauncey G. Lee. The house was last occupied for public worship June 13, 1847.

The second house of worship was raised July 20, 1847. It was dedicated to the worship of God Dec. 15, 1847, with religious service as follows.

Invocation and reading of the Scriptures by Rev. C.T. Prentice of Easton – portions from Kings Chap. 4, and Psalm 24.

Singing – Anthem "The Earth Is the Lords" & Ps. 24.

Prayer by Rev. T. Punderson of Huntington.

Singing Hymn, "When Here, O Lord, We Seek Thy Face" & Sermon and Dedicatory prayer by Rev. R.D. Gardner, the Pastor of the Church, from Ephesians 2:20, 21.

Singing, Anthem "How Beautiful Upon the Mountain", & Concluding prayer by Rev. J. Atwater of Newtown.

Singing Ps. 117, "From All That Dwell Below the Skies" & with Doxology to God the father, & Benediction by the Pastor.

The same entry records that, "New church built this year at expense of \$2,650", which converts to \$90,100 in today's currency value. This olde house has seen its changes. It is a bit bigger, the side balconies, pew doors, gas lighting, and stained glass windows, have long departed. A cross and flags now adorn the newer chancel. But the original bell from our first Meeting House still peels the "call to worship" to a still devoted congregation of faith, hope, and love that does justice, loves kindness, and walks humbly with the Lord our God. It is rededicated every Sunday.
