#### The Weary World Rejoices

Are you weary this December? I am. As your pastor, I may (or may not) know what you've gone through this year, but I'm sure there are places in your soul in which you feel weary. Weariness from watching the news, weariness from taking care of a loved one, weariness from work, the list goes on. How can we have hope and joy this Christmas amid all this weariness? We may turn to familiar seasonal music to reset our souls. One of my favorite Christmas hymns has a lyric that always stands out to me: *A thrill of hope, a weary world rejoices...* 

"O Holy Night" is a song celebrating the birth of Jesus. It invites us into the sandals of the shepherds, the wise men, and the everyday Israelite who was waiting for the birth of the Messiah. The nation of Israel had been waiting hundreds of years for the promised Messiah to come. They knew what it was like to experience heavy burdens as they were once slaves in Egypt and eventually became exiled from their land. And even though they had returned, they were weary under Roman rule and occupation. They longed for the Messiah to come and bring them comfort, liberation and rest.

Moments of waiting can be opportunities to slow down and be still. Advent, therefore, is meant to be a time in which we may slow down. We know that Christmas is coming, but it isn't here yet. So instead of rushing to get our Christmas gift list all checked off or hurrying through all the social events between now and Dec 25th, we can allow ourselves to take opportunities for reflection and contemplation, thinking about what, (or rather whom) this season is all about. Materials for Advent home observance, including candles, a devotional and advent calendar from "Sanctified Art" may be found in Wilton Hall for your household – please help yourself.

Everything changed the night Christ was born. Those that got to see the baby with their eyes experienced a thrill of hope. The Prince of Peace, the one who would give them rest, was here. They could rejoice even in their weariness, knowing that the Messiah had finally come.

Even though we have not witnessed the birth of Christ with our two eyes, we have witnessed the work of Christ within our hearts. Christmas reminds us how the baby born in Bethlehem grew up to be an adult. He would forgive sins and heal those afflicted with disease. He would open His arms wide and say, "Come to me all who are weary and heavy laden, and I will give you rest." The story of Christmas, and the good news of the gospel, teaches us how hope and joy can never be removed from us, no matter how weary and overwhelmed we may personally be.

If you feel weary this Christmas, I pray that you will remember that you can find rest in the arms of the Prince of Peace. I pray that hope will fill your heart, and that your soul, even in a weary world, rejoices. Join us in worship this Advent and Christmas season here at MCC. Bring your family, neighbors, and friends to "see" for themselves!





#### Elisha's Corner The Picture Gallery By Gary Thompson, Church Historian

Additions have been made to the photo gallery in the rear entrance to the Meeting House. There are seven new pictures and two paintings. The pictures feature the Beardsley Family and a composite photo of Dr. and Elizabeth Beardsley, women of the Ladies Improvement League in front of Beardsley Hall, the first parsonage on Old Tannery Road, two of the church choir, and a photo by David Walker that you will recognize. The paintings are of the Meeting House by David K. Merrill provided by Martha Beardsley and the original rendering of Rexford House.

A handwritten note in an envelope taped to the back of the Merrill painting of the church contains the name and address of Martha (Merrill) Beardsley, the artist's sister. The note states that, "This was the women who brought painting of church by David Merrill belonging to Clara Johnson for the church." The painting is signed by Merrill in its lower

left corner, but it is undated. Clara Johnson may be a cousin of Martha Merrill, as her mother's maiden name was Marion Johnson. Martha was the wife of Olen Beardsley, who was the grandson of Dr. Edward and Elizabeth Beardsley (for whom Beardsley Hall is named). Martha died in January 2012 and Olen died in September 2019. They lived out their lives in Livermore Falls, Maine.



David Merrill is a Monroe native, was a classmate with June Wininger, and later lived for a time in Newtown. Now at age 87, David Merrill lives in Southbury. For over fifty years he has painted over 24 murals and an enumerable number of commissioned paintings of New England scenery and vintage buildings; 52 of which are of Monroe. Between 1981 and 1982 he painted a mural on the wall of the Masuk High School library which was subsequently moved to the Edith Wheeler Library

in 2007, where it is today. In addition to the church painting, a lithograph of *Olde Monroe Centre Green* by David Merrill hangs over the mantle in the Dineson Parlor in Rexford House.

The rendering of Rexford House was provided by Henry T. Moeckel & Associates, Architects, of Naugatuck, Connecticut. The legend card inside the frame indicates that it is of the "*Proposed New Church Facilities for the Monroe Congregational Church United Church of Christ Monroe, Connecticut.*" At the far right side of the building is the "Phase 2" part of Rexford House, not included in the final construction, which contained 4,600 square feet of additional storage and classroom space. In today's dollars it would have cost well over \$1.5 million. Good reason at the time for postponing its proposed construction.

Behind every picture there is usually an interesting story.

This is our inclement weather policy, including who makes decisions about closings and how the decision is spread in the community. If you serve in a position of responsibility, please find your leadership role below.

# In Person Sunday Worship Services:

- 1. At 7 am, Pastor (Jenn Gingras, 203-895-5607) and the current Chair of Deacons make the decision whether or not to cancel in-person worship. If in-person worship is cancelled, Jenn will record and upload an abbreviated worship service on <a href="https://www.youtube.com/monroecongregationalchurchucc">https://www.youtube.com/monroecongregationalchurchucc</a> by noon (sermon, prayer, announcements)
- Jenn notifies staff and key volunteers (who in turn notify those they work with), including Jeanette Cardentey-Morales (203-257-9637), Will Duchon (203-615-3908), Reader, Usher and Trustee of the Day. Jenn sends a church-wide e-mail and posts on FB (MCC-UCC Conversation and Monroe Cong Church Page)
- 3. Chair of Deacons notifies CT Weather/IAN Snap, Channel 8 & Channel 3
- 4. **Committee meetings** are cancelled at the discretion of committee chair, although many are held on Zoom at the moment, so weather shouldn't be a problem!

**Sr. & Jr. PF** groups will be notified of any changes or cancellations by e-mail, phone tree and/or Facebook notifications as appropriate.
