

Elisha's Corner By Gary Thompson, Church Historian

Pulpit Suppliers – John Moss

It is not surprising that fifty-two year old John Moss (Jr.) was selected to the first committee to supply the pulpit and "... provide a Minister or Ministers to preach ye Gospels among us". He, along with Peter Curtiss and Samuel Beardslee, were instructed by the General Assembly to call the meeting on June 21, 1762 to establish the New Stratford Parish. He was also from a family of prominent ministers; his second cousin was married to Rev. Ebenezer White of the Danbury Congregational Church, his great uncle Rev. Joseph Moss was the minister of the neighboring Derby Congregational Church, his greatgreat uncle Rev. Joseph Moss was the founding minister of the Congregational Church of Wallingford – all in Connecticut - and his great-great grandfather was the Rev. William Moss of Manchester, England. His family ancestry was not tied to the original settlement of Stratford, but to that of New Haven and Wallingford. John Moss, "being the oldest son", resided on the forty acres bequeathed to him in 1723 by his father John Moss (Sr.) on the north side of Church Street between Wheeler Rod and Monroe Tpk. (it was the upper section of Moose Hill that intersected with Wheeler Hill at the north and Church Lane at the south). His younger brother, Captain Joseph Moss, whom we know as the leaser of the Parish cemetery and a quarter acre of land for the centre green gifted to the Parish, resided on the bequeathed thirty acres to the south side of Church Street to (Old) Tannery Road.

John (Jr.) was born in Jamaica, New York about 1710, but his youth may have been spend in New Haven where around age twenty or twenty-one he married Sabine Cox, a New Haven girl of sixteen years. They had two sons. John (III) was the oldest. She may have died after child birth in 1734 when second son William was born. Between 1734 and 1735, John was remarried to Sarah Salmon of Stratford. She was eighteen. By the time he was selected to the New Stratford Parish committee his household had grown to six sons and five daughters; perhaps including twins. His last child and youngest son Elihu was only three years old at the time. His eighth child, son Daniel, was born in 1756 and latter became a minister residing in Dorset, VT. At the age of sixty-seven he was listed as a clerk for Capt. Samuel Beardslee's Company, 4th Regiment of the Connecticut Militia during the 1777 campaign at Peekskill and Fishkill New York against the British. On February 3, 1789, at the age of seventy-nine he died and was buried in the Parish Cemetery (provided by his younger brother) with his wife Sarah who predeceased him on April 29, 1788 at the age of 68. They are now buried in the Monroe Center Cemetery.

His father, John (Sr.), born in Wallingford, and his mother, Jane Thompson, settled in Stratford after their marriage in New Haven on Dec 22, 1707. John (Sr.) was thirty, born January 7, 1677, and Jane was twenty-four, born on October 29, 1683. They must have lived in Jamaica, New York for a few years, for that is where their first son, John (Jr.) and third daughter, Mehitabel were born. In the fourteen years between 1708 and 1722, they had two sons and five daughters; all growing to maturity. Their resettlement in Stratford after 1720 may have brought about the purchase of the property on the northern end of Moose Hill. His Will references a "shop" at his residence with "house" and "barn". It appears that he was a merchant of moderate means as well as a farmer. Being the oldest son and only thirteen years old at the time of his father's death, John (Jr.) and his mother may have maintained the "shop" for her support and that of his siblings for another twenty years when his mother died. Being a merchant may also have been the reason for moving from Stratford to Jamaica, New York, and then back to Stratford in pursuit of more lucrative trading. John (Sr.) died on February 8, 1723, at the early age of forty-six. His wife, Jane, died twenty years later on September 28, 1743.

John Moss' father and John (Jr.)'s grandfather was Mercy Moss who was born in New Haven and baptized on April 1, 1649 in the "First Congregational Society" meeting house in New Haven. In 1669 he may have moved to the newly created Wallingford with his mother and father, two older brothers and two older sisters. Although, being only nineteen at the time it is more likely that he stayed in New Haven to complete his education. Both ancestors and descendants were well educated. Mercy married his wife Elizabeth in 1676 or 1677 when he was twenty-seven and she twenty-two. They had only two sons. Son John (Sr.) was only eight years old and son Sgt. William Moss only three when Mercy died at the early age of thirty-five on March 3, 1685. Widow Elizabeth remarried thereafter to Deacon John Rose of Branford were the boys grew up and where Deacon John Rose and Elizabeth raised three more sons. Mercy was buried in New Haven. Elizabeth, who lived another thirty-four years until January 21, 1720, was buried with her second husband in the Congregational Church Cemetery in Branford.

Mercy's father was yet another John Moss. He was born most likely in Cotheridge, Wiltshire, England in 1603 or 1604, although some genealogies have him born in Manchester, England, where his father was a minister. Cotheridge, though, is about fifty miles northwest of Oxford. Ten miles south of Oxford is Wallingford, Berkshire, England, It is here were at age thirty-five he married Abigail ("Goody") Charles in 1637, and then with a group from Wallingford, including his brother-in-law John Charles, nine year old sister-in-law, Mary Charles, and his sister Sarah Moss Geare and her husband John, Abraham Doolittle, and John Brocket left for New England. There are two accounts as to how they arrived there. The first says that they sailed on the Hector with the Rev. John Davenport Co. that arrived in Boston on June 25, 1637. The passenger list for that voyage only lists John Brocket with that group and not the Mosses. The other and more adventurous story tells us that they sailed on the Winterhee which was ship-wretched at sea (likely in the recorded Atlantic hurricane). The survivors, including the Moss party, were rescued by a ship in the area bound for Barbados, were they were deposited. From there they managed passage to Boston and met up with the Davenport Co. Later, that same year in 1637 the Hector took the group to the New Haven plantation before returning to England. John Moss was a lawyer and an original proprietor in the New Haven colony. He helped draft and was an original signer of the compact establishing the colony in 1639 as well as helping Rev. Davenport establishes the first Congregational Church in New Haven where John Moss served as Deacon. In that same year he became a member of the first (Connecticut Colony) General Court and served the residence for some years in that capacity. He saw action in the King Philips War as a Corporal with the "New Haven Train Band" and was later commissioned a Captain. In the sixteen years between 1639 and 1655, John and Abigail Moss had six sons and five daughters. Only six of the eleven survived to adulthood. Their first child, son John, and fifth child, son Ephraim, died in infancy. Mercy was their seventh child.

By 1667 John Moss prevailed upon the General Court as Deputy to allow him, John Brocket, and Abraham Doolittle to purchase (invest in) property and establish the village of Wallingford (after Wallingford, England). In 1670, and at the age of sixty-seven, he was one of the incorporators of the City of Wallingford. He and Brocket later negotiated with the Quinnipiac Indian Tribe to purchase land that included present day Meriden for spoons, coats, knifes, hatchets, hoes, and scissors. He remained a resident of Wallingford until March 31, 1707, when he died at the age of one hundred and three. He is buried in the city's Center Street Cemetery.

This is our inclement weather policy, including who makes decisions about closings and how the decision is spread in the community. If you serve in a position of responsibility, please find your leadership role below.

In Person Sunday Worship Services:

- At 7 am, Pastor (Jenn Gingras, 203-895-5607) and the current Chair of Deacons make the decision whether or not to cancel in-person worship. If in-person worship is cancelled, Jenn will record and upload an abbreviated worship service on <u>https://www.youtube.com/monroecongregationalchurchucc</u> by noon (sermon, prayer, announcements)
- Jenn notifies staff and key volunteers (who in turn notify those they work with), including Jeanette Cardentey-Morales (203-257-9637), Will Duchon (203-615-3908), Reader, Usher and Trustee of the Day. Jenn sends a church-wide e-mail and posts on FB (MCC-UCC Conversation and Monroe Cong Church Page)
- 3. Chair of Deacons notifies CT Weather/IAN Snap, Channel 8 & Channel 3
- 4. **Committee meetings** are cancelled at the discretion of committee chair, although many are held on Zoom at the moment, so weather shouldn't be a problem!

Sr. & Jr. PF groups will be notified of any changes or cancellations by e-mail, phone tree and/or Facebook notifications as appropriate.
