Music Notes

This morning's offertory anthem, "Lord of All Beauty" is a choral arrangement of a beautiful song composed by Clara Schumann in 1841, when she was 22 years old. For many years I have wanted to have our choir sing this in church. However, there were two problems which prevented this: 1) the song was originally composed for one singer and piano accompaniment, not four-part chorus, and 2) the original text was a love poem by the German poet Friederich Ruckert (titled "If You Love for Beauty") and not a "sacred" piece of church music.

Last year I was very happy to discover a new choral arrangement of "If You Love for Beauty", and got hold of it immediately for our choir to work on. The only remaining obstacle was altering the text to make the piece appropriate and meaningful for our worship services. In a rare moment of wisdom and ingenuity I contacted my friend Rob Stuart, a poet and retired Presbyterian minister, and asked Rob to compose suitable lyrics for "If You Love for Beauty". Within a few days, Rob supplied a new text, explaining: I have written the song as a love song between the believing/doubting person and God, Lord of all beauty. It is a meditation with interior dialogue, or conversation between the person and God. With the repetition of the theme I have a repetition of questions in the dialogue. Then the burst of declaration of love from God and the believer's affirmation in response, to conclude.

I am very grateful to Rob for his poetic text, and grateful to Clara Schumann for this beautiful music. I am also grateful to YOU for reading this, which probably takes longer to read than listening to the actual music itself.
