On Fads & Faith



One of the first things that Clark told me upon my return to the "real world" from our mission trip in Kentucky was this: "I can't believe it. It's been strange around here! So many kids wandering around the green, around the church, on our lawn, staring at their phones. They are making the dogs bark like crazy!"

Since I had been living disconnected from the news, I had to ask my daughter Cady to catch me up on this latest fad, a smart phone game called, "Pokemon Go." As with many electronic games, players move through an artificial reality to find resources, capture monsters, and earn points. What's different about this artificial reality is that it is

tied to the real world. Players have to physically get outside to find these things and earn their rewards. Personally, I think it's a great idea to get folks out of their homes and into the fresh air!

It's been so popular that the game makers have struggled to provide enough computer capacity to serve all the players. The major demographic of the game appear to be millennials, who feel a twinge of nostalgia for their childhoods collecting cards and watching Pokemon-based cartoons. Popularity can be a fleeting thing. My youth was spent coveting Jordache Jeans, Cabbage Patch Dolls and trying to finish my Rubix Cube. In my daughter's childhood it was American Dolls and Beanie Babies. Though some of these fads have remained on store shelves, others have faded away. I expect that something else will come along soon that will overtake this temporary Pokemon Go fever.

Two thousand years ago, an itinerant rabbi and preacher sparked a movement that has endured. He called people to care compassionately for each other, and for religious leaders to relax their restrictions. Through many years of change and adaptation (and despite some major failures to hold to the teachings of Jesus), the Church has continued to share the message of God's love.

In our day, we face the challenge of distinguishing fads which fade from the movements which endure. Pokemon GO is a fad, even if it does propel more people into the public square. Volunteer Opportunities with Empowering Children & Families

Mentor: ECF's Mentoring Program helps to empower at-risk youth in to make positive life choices that enable them to maximize their

potential. The mentoring program uses adult volunteers who commit to supporting, guiding, and being a friend to a young person for a period of at least one year. By becoming part of the social network of adults and community members who care about the youth, the mentor can help youth develop and reach positive academic, career, and personal goals.

- Take the lead in supporting a young person through an ongoing, one-on-one relationship
- Serve as a positive role model and friend
- Build the relationship by planning and participating in activities together
- Strive for mutual respect
- Build self-esteem and motivation
- Help set goals and work toward accomplishing them

Educational Advocate & Tutor: ECF's Educational Advocates helps to ensure the optimum educational wellbeing of a child participating in our program. Works with program coordinator to review psychoeducational needs and establish a plan for working with the child. Provides support to child and family regarding school meetings, IEP's, specialized tutoring, and on-going educational planning for the child. This person helps to inform the teacher and school of potential supports to help the child in the classroom and school environment. In the event the child needs extra help, the Educational Advocate helps coordinate tutoring services and/or do the tutoring themselves. The ECF Program Coordinator will help the volunteer to identify necessary supports prior to engaging with the child.
