"Be alert and watch, for you don't know when the time will come. What I say to you, I say to all. Stay alert." Mark 13:33

When Mark's gospel was recorded, followers of the way fully expected that in the very near future Jesus would return in glory and bring all of creation into the fullness of God's reign. The Apostle Paul held the same understanding when he wrote to the



church at Corinth when he urged them to be faithful and continue to develop the gifts they have received, because the Lord was going to return very soon.

About 2,000 years later, and it hasn't quite happened as they expected! We are still waiting. Waiting and watching is what Advent season is all about. Stay vigilant and alert to the coming of Jesus! We, like the early disciples, don't know when that final coming will happen, but there are many ways Jesus comes into our life when we are alert enough to notice.

As we prepare to celebrate that incredible act on the part of God, consider how Jesus came into the midst of the human family - born in a stable, a short time homeless, certainly a refugee. And yet, in our culture the Thanksgiving turkey is barely cold before we feel the pressure to take part in the nearest Black Friday Christmas sale!

It's ironic, since Jesus first came among us as a poor person. When Jesus was tempted later in his life in the desert to change stones into bread, he responded with: "No, see, I don't accumulate all kinds of material things. I have enough."

Be alert; and think about how Jesus came, identifying himself with the poor and oppressed. If we really want to welcome Jesus into our midst, we might remember how he showed us the way to the fullness of life by making certain that everyone has enough. May it be so, and may it be soon!

Thanks to **Peggy Villani** for reminding us in worship on November 19th that the ground for Rexford House was broken 50 years ago! Here is an excerpt from the historical article that she referenced in her announcement:

The Building of Monroe Congregational Church, United Church of Christ

Member Jean Loveland originally wrote the following history in 1967. It has been updated to include more recent information.

... By 1956, the church facilities were outgrown, except for the meeting house itself. In order to accommodate the needs of an expanding membership, a fund drive was conducted. With the monies raised, new school rooms and other facilities were added to Beardsley Hall along Route 111.

Even though there were multiple expansions in the past, the church was in need of additional space. Study groups and building committees worked on a new construction plan to meet those needs. Ground was broken on Thanksgiving Sunday, November 19, 1967 for a new building and in 1968 Rexford House opened.

The town of Monroe continued to grow over the next decade and a half. It became evident the next building that needed expansion was the meeting house. In 1985, worship services were now held in what is known as Wilton Hall and ground was broken to enlarge the meeting house. Additional pews were installed, a handicap entrance provided, the balcony opened and the interior of the building was restored to as near as possible to its original appearance. On March 2, 1986 the meeting house was re-opened and the first worship service was held in the newly renovated building.
