I thank my God every time I remember you... It is right for me to think this way about all of you, because you hold me in your heart, for all of you share in God's grace with me, both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel. (Philippians 1:3, 7)

You know the saying, "if you want something done right, do it yourself?" I think there is something about human nature in which we want to be self-sufficient. Nothing seems to foster respect more than appearing to be a self-made person. But the truth is, no one is truly self-made. From the families we come from, to the communities we live in; our help comes from a wide circle of people. The healthiest people I know are aware of this, honor this, and are thankful.

The Christian life teaches us that ALL of us are dependent on the grace of God, so we try to replace our pride with gratitude. It is the nature of life in general (and of the church in particular) to be communal. We live in relationship with the God we encounter in Jesus and with each other. Autonomy, tempting as it may be, is just not an option for the faithful.

You know this. After all, could any one of us pull off a Strawberry Festival on our own?

The Apostle Paul held no such self-made illusions about himself. He knew that his work depended on the support of others. The Philippian church was especially supportive and generous; his work was heavily underwritten by their love and generosity. He depended on them and was deeply thankful for their companionship and partnership in the gospel.

The temptation to try to believe that we are the only ones responsible for ourselves remains. If we believe that our God is a God of grace, then we are humbled and grateful for the gifts that come our way. We will be thankful to those who have shared them



with us. And we will be generous in sharing them with others, for they were never just ours anyway. Every good gift has come, in one way or another, from God. Happy June, dear ones!

Last March we held our church's annual Tag Sale for charity.

Thanks to everyone who sorted, set up, transported or donated their gently used stuff, or who worked with our Outreach team on the day of the sale. We couldn't do it without you! We made a total of \$2,782.27. We wanted to fill you in on where the money we raised will be spent:



- ❖ \$250 in Home Depot gift cards for the Adult Mission trip to Puerto Rico for paint and supplies
- ❖ \$500 to Strengthen the Church (<http://www.ucc.org/stc>), an annual offering of the United Church of Christ that supports new church plants, awakens new ideas in existing churches and develops the spiritual life in our youth and young adults. This year, 90% of the Strengthen the Church offerings will be given to Silver Lake Conference Center.
- ❖ \$500 for Homes for the Brave (<https://www.homesforthebrave.org/>), which provides the housing and services necessary to help homeless veterans return to a productive and meaningful life.
- ❖ \$500 to Empowering Children and Families (<http://www.empoweringct.org/>), whose mission is to help children and families construct and sustain a healthy foundation for the future.

The remainder we are holding on to, in anticipation of upcoming needs throughout the year. Again, thanks so much for helping out your neighbors at our annual tag sale!

They are originally from the Congo and spent the last 21 years in a Rwandan refugee camp. The family consists of the mother and her 3 sons. The youngest son is hearing impaired and non-verbal. The family is very happy to be here and anxious to begin their new life. They are currently learning or enhancing their English, getting health exams and settling in to a new environment.
