"Some Thoughts for the Lenten Journey"

From Ash Wednesday, March 1, until Passion/Palm Sunday, April 9, we travel on a Lenten journey together and observe forty days when we engage in some sort of a spiritual discipline to prepare our hearts and minds for Holy Week. During Lent this year I am rereading *Falling Upward: A Spirituality for the Two Halves of Life* (2011) by Franciscan Priest, Father Richard Rohr. One of the most provocative ideas in the book includes the concept of having the awareness of a "stumbling stone" in our lives. Author, Rohr, describes it this way.

Sooner or later, if you are on any classic "spiritual schedule," some event, person, death, idea, or relationship will enter your life that you simply cannot deal with, using your present skill set, your acquired knowledge, or your strong willpower. Spiritually speaking, you will be, you must be, led to the edge of your own private resources. At that point you will stumble over a necessary stumbling stone, as Isaiah calls it; or to state it in our language here, you will and you must "lose" at something. This is the only way that Life-Fate-God-Grace-Mystery can get you to change, let go of your egocentric preoccupations, and go on the further and larger journey. I wish I could say this was not true, but it is darn near absolute in the spiritual literature of the world. (Rohr, "Stumbling Over the Stumbling Stone," Chapter 5, pp. 65-66)

Since rethinking this concept in the last few days, I am wondering what is the "stumbling stone" that has brought me "to the edge of [my] own private resources?"

Could it be when I forget to slow down and take one-day-at-a-time when family, school, and work responsibilities accumulate too quickly? Do I think I am so important that everything depends on me? Or am I willing to let go and surrender to God's power, infinitely greater than myself, that will bring balance and regulation back into my life? The journey through Lent is a time when we can take a deep breath, move a step back, slow down, and remember that we are never alone on the journey to Jerusalem. Others will go with us, side by side, or even a little ahead of us.

On March 8th, Fran Harmeyer, an Occupational Therapist (OT) at Griffin Hospital, and Len

M-RNING CIRCLE Berger, a Trustee of the Lions Low Vision Centers (LLVC) of Fairfield & New Haven Counties, will present a seminar at the Monroe Congregational Church. This program was started by the Lion Clubs in Connecticut in 1990 and provides anyone with low vision issues FREE

devices which could improve his/her vision and quality of life.

"Low vision" is that degree of vision loss that can no longer be corrected by eyeglasses, contacts, medicine or surgery. These conditions are usually age-related including macular degeneration, glaucoma, and diabetic retinopathy.

After visiting an ophthalmologist or optometrist and receiving a low vision diagnosis, the eye professional will send a prescription form to one of six LVCCs. The closest one is in Griffin Hospital, Derby. After meeting with the OT, appropriate devices are obtained from the Lions and provided FREE by the OT.

This dynamic program is provided by the Morning Circle and will be held on 3/8/2017 at 11:15AM. All members of the Monroe Congregational Church are welcomed!
