Our foster daughter came to us with a broken cell phone. Her former foster mom gave it to her, probably to quell the insistent and constant request "*Can I have a phone*?" This phone is a hot mess – the screen is shattered and the face is dark. When it is charged, it sounds an alarm at 1:30 in the afternoon. When she hears the "music" she takes the phone, lifts it to the sky and twirls in a circle.

Other than this daily reminder, the phone is about as useful as a rock. And yet, when she gets home, she searches for the last place she put it, just so

she can carry it around. She walks around outside talking to it as if there is someone on the other end. She tries to take "selfie videos", pretending she is a teenager with her own YouTube channel.

After weeks of this, I finally had the bright idea to ask her WHY she is so attached to a broken phone. "*I just want to be cool*" she said. The world has changed a lot since Clark and I parented the first time. Our oldest was a freshman in high school when we got her an "unsmart" flip phone. Our son was never too into it in the first place and only saw his phone as a tool. Our PF'ers tell me that her behavior (for a 9 year old) is normal.

I get it - our lives are busy. Our phones are busy. Our family members are busy. Our friends are busy. And our minds are busy. It makes me wonder, with all these busy signals, is there still space for the Holy Spirit break through and make a connection?

Turning off our phones may not be feasible for many of us, because they are a tool that connects us with ways we sustain and provide for ourselves and loved ones. But it's also true that the loudest, most incessant buzzes demanding our attention can also be the least nourishing for our souls. We get used to answering them out of habit or a sense of obligation. I'm sure you can think of a few annoying and energy wasting distractions that technology has gifted us with (telemarketers come to mind!)

Perhaps it sounds mundane; but unplugging from only a few distractions can make us feel much freer. When we eliminate the unimportant, we find the time to give to that which is important, like our journey of faith, our relationship with God and other people, and appreciating and caring for this precious earth. May you, in this Eastertide, find ways to unplug and be present.



Elisha's Corner: Mystery Solved

There's nothing like a good "who-done-it". The stories that ask the questions "Who"? "What"? "When"? "Where"? and "Why"? I started a little who-done-it in the March *Steeple* when discussing the pen and ink picture of the 1847 Meeting House and left you with the question, ".... who is William Feeny"?

It's like putting a genealogy search into an historic event. So now who is he? Bill Feeny was born on April 14, 1930 in the Bellerose section of Queens, New York. He graduated from Adelphi College and became an artist. In 1958, Bill and his wife Fredrika moved to Monroe with their young family: Elizabeth, William, Edward, and Brian. According to conversations with those of you who remember them, they lived on Elm Street, near Purdy Hill Road. On December 7, 1958, the Reverend Raymond Ward received Bill and his wife as new members of our congregation, and until 1964/65 Bill served as a Deacon.

Not only was he an artist, Bill was remembered by some of you as an aviator. Flying out of the Monroe Airport, on Moose Hill Road (now a cemetery) Bill introduced many of

the local teenagers to the experience of small craft flight. He is credited with organizing the Monroe Cadet Squadron of the Connecticut Civil Air Patrol. While in town he authored and had published *In Their Honor: True Stories of Fliers from Whom United States Air Force Bases Are Named.* He also illustrated this 223 page book in pen and ink. In 1969 the Feeny family moved to Madison Wisconsin where Bill joined the art faculty of Madison Area Technical College. His career success there earned him the college's Distinguished Teacher of the Year award in 1990. He retired in 1992. So that is the "Who" of our mystery story.

It was in 1964, while living in Monroe, when Bill pen and inked the picture of the 1847 Meeting House. That's the "What", "When", and "Where" of our story. So now we have all of answers to the mystery except one. All good mystery events have a motive. WHY? Two clues finally came to surface while investigating this picture; Lori Loveland's note with the picture that she sent to me and the date 1964. In that year Bill was asked, or maybe volunteered, to illustrate the cover of Lori's mother's booklet *Historic Sketch of the Monroe Congregational Church*, which she authored and had published in 1964. No doubt that is why Lori had it among her mother's files. The booklet and the cover illustration were printed to commemorate the 200th anniversary of our congregation. Now why should I have not known that to begin with? On the inside back cover of the booklet the credits indicate, "Cover artist, William D. Feeny". Later in the 1960's when the Ladies Fellowship needed a cover for their thank-you note stationary, which was sold at the Christmas Bazaars, Bill's rendering fit their need perfectly. So there you have it; mystery solved.

Keep in mind now that the definition of conviction is an unwavering strong certainty of belief, whereas convention is a current custom or traditional practice of one's belief. What is it that has raised Bill Feeny's church sketch to this level of inquiry? It is that it has become the iconic image of the congregation's Victorian era when life was, if not altogether easier, then at least more simple and refined, and when conviction still mattered more than convention.

William D. Feeny died on his birthday in Fitchburg, Wisconsin on April 14, 2007 at the exact age of seventy-seven.

First Sampled at Silver Lake on Women's Retreat, March 2019

PREHEAT OVEN TO 350

WARM

3 cups of honey 1 ¹/₂ cups of melted butter

POUR OVER

1 cup of shredded coconut
1 cup of uncooked quick oats
1 cup of raisins/craisins
1 cup of grated carrots
2 grated apples
Optional – 1 cup of nuts

ADD

2 cups of orange juice2 eggs1 tbsp Vanilla

MIX DRY INGREDIENTS

- 4 cups of flour
- 1 tsp of salt
- 1 tbsp of baking powder
- 1 tbsp of baking soda
- 1 tbsp of cinnamon

MIX WET INGREDIENTS INTO DRY INGREDIENTS Bake 15-20 minutes

Makes about 4 dozen regular sized muffins
