

To be sure, visitation will come easier for some people than others. Visiting is a viable ministry for people who enjoy others company, especially if their heart reaches out to people who are hurting, lonely, or in need.

The Lay Pastoral Visitation Ministry is a new initiative of the Monroe Congregational Church which provides care, attention, and spiritual support to individuals in our church, especially our elders and persons with special needs. If you think this ministry may be a good fit for you, and you have at least 3 hours to volunteer each month, we'd love to have you join us.

The three-part training will be led by me and Rev. Dr. Sheldon Smith, a retired clergyperson and current MCC Deacon. Following the Passing of the Peace I spring into action and stroll up and down the sanctuary addressing everyone present. I do not call the children forward, I speak to everyone. I ask questions; I call on folks who would like to answer; I typically do a "repeat after me" prayer.

Rationale: I do not call the children forward for a few reasons; 1) some children might be uncomfortable coming forward; 2) some children might be too comfortable coming forward; 3) my message is for "All of God's children"; 4) I am passionate about Intergenerational Faith Formation.

When Pastor Jenn does the "Children's Message" she will use her style of delivery, which I am sure will include calling the children forward – after all that is her time with them as their Pastor.
