Re-Discovering Our Identities: 2022 Sabbatical Plans

I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; my soul knows it very well. - Psalm 139:14

Last month I shared with a few people my sadness when handling one of my daughter's recent "Spirit Day" assignments about her heritage. Her teacher asked everyone in her class to bring in something

about their heritage. It could be a food item, a traditional dress, or anything we could come up with to display where her people come from. The problem was, besides the "we think she's Hispanic" note in her DCF file, our adopted daughter has no idea about her roots. We tried to suggest she use ours – Irish, French Canadian, English (we are her family, after all) but it just didn't seem right so she chose to not participate. Not knowing your roots is a difficult thing for adoptees to handle. It wasn't until 2 years ago that I was able to have my heritage confirmed through 23 & Me (I am half adopted, which is a story for another day). We've done the same for her, and hope to get the results back any day now.

My reflection upon this matter got me to dreaming about my next sabbatical, which is due to come up next year in 2022. What if I used that time to research our combined family roots and visit some of the places she and I are from? To not only take in the sights, but experience the culture, art, food and recreation? And then, stick our toes in the sand for a good long time and just rest, because this has been a challenging time in the life of the church, and I need it.

And then I got to thinking about what the church might do while I was away. It would probably work out best to be gone over the summer, right after the 50th Strawberry Festival in late June when things are a little quieter. We'll need a good interim, one that can manage the day-to-day pastoral needs of the church and offer thoughtful and uplifting worship. As I will be working on my family's identity, I'm proposing this as a wonderful time to re-discover MCC's congregational identity. My hope is that our congregation's leaders will find an interim who is able to hold conversations about who we are, in order to define and celebrate the identity that emerges. Upon my return, we will engage in conversations together about what we learned about our roots. How exciting!

In order to support these lofty goals, I am applying for The Lilly Endowment Clergy Renewal Programs at Christian Theological Seminary. Lilly supports grants that seek to strengthen Christian congregations through renewal and reflection, providing an opportunity for pastors to step away from the persistent obligations of daily parish life and engage in a sabbatical period of renewal and reflection. The program is designed for those congregations and pastors who have a strong relationship with one another, a high degree of mutual trust and support, and are eager to see their relationship strengthened, renewed and continued. Eligible congregations may apply for grants of up to \$50,000 each to support a renewal program for their pastor. Up to \$15,000 of the grant may be used for congregational expenses associated with the renewal program (this would be helpful to cover the interim's compensation). The deadline for 2022 grants is April 21, 2021, so if you see me muttering to myself about the rather arduous task of grant-writing please throw a "you can do it, Jenn" my way!
