**Naming Our Blessings**



It was just about this time last year. There I was, surrounded by 30+ people who were sending one another off to placements where we would spend three months listening to people suffering from great pain and trauma. We held hands and declared ourselves a family. The synergy and energy that connected us was palpable and our gratitude for one another was clear.

As we shared affirmations, we recognized the innovation that had been created, imagined the creativity yet to bloom and honored both the wisdom of our elders in our midst and the passionate energy of our younger adults. How amazing and humbling it was to be surrounded by a room full of internationals who not only passionately held on to the ideal of changing the world, but who were making conscious choices every day to do that very thing!

Each of us, who came from different contexts and places, deeply believed that the groups, families and systems in which we walk everyday possess the wisdom to embrace peace. The wisdom in our stories contain rich resources which will allow us to transform what was good in the past into what can be great in the future.

Last Spring, as I returned from this time of learning in my EAPPI community, I began to reflect on the changes that lie before us as a faith community. As we who call ourselves 'the church' confront societal and structural shifts, it can be easy to feel like we are becoming unmoored from our identity. As the institutions that once grounded us respond to change we can feel anxiety about how we might ensure that those coming after us are nurtured, disciplined and stewarded well.

No matter how tempting it might be to desire a quick fix, there is no cookie cutter answer. What my experience in Jerusalem reminds me is that in each of our lives and stories, the past can embolden a life-giving future if we recognize that it is in God's abundance that we are sharing. We are called to share that abundance extravagantly, even with abandon! It just takes generosity of heart, deep listening, reaching out and a big dose of hope. Our passion can take us into places unknown. In Christian language, this sometimes is referred to as

'bearing the Cross'. During this Lenten time, when shadows gather, we remember that when sacrifice, loss and sorrow are the places into which we walk, it is love for others - the stranger, refugee, widow and orphan - that carries us through. We are called to be co-creators of God's kingdom, which is constantly coming and which we will never fully see in this mortal journey called life.

### **Good Friday – What's so Good About It?**

It is the day when Christians commemorate Jesus Christ's crucifixion. So why is it called Good Friday? According to the Bible, the son of God was flogged, ordered to carry the cross on which he would be crucified and then put to death. It's difficult to see what is "good" about it. Some sources suggest that the day is "good" in that it is holy, or that the phrase is a corruption of "God's Friday".



However, according to the Oxford English Dictionary, the adjective traditionally "designates a day on (or sometimes a season in) which religious observance is held". The OED states that "good" in this context refers to "a day or season observed as holy by the church", hence the greeting "good tide" at Christmas or on Shrove Tuesday. In addition to Good Friday, there is also a less well-known Good Wednesday, namely the Wednesday before Easter.

The earliest known use of "guode friday" is found in The South English Legendary, a text from around 1290, according to the dictionary. According to the Baltimore Catechism - the standard US Catholic school text from 1885 to the 1960s, Good Friday is good because Christ "showed His great love for man, and purchased for him every blessing".

The Catholic Encyclopedia, first published in 1907, states that the term's origins are not clear. It says some sources see its origins in the term "God's Friday" or *Gottes Freitag*, while others maintain that it is from the German *Gute Freitag*. It notes that the day was called Long Friday by the Anglo-Saxons and is referred to as such in modern Danish. It also says that the day is known as "the Holy and Great Friday" in the Greek liturgy, "Holy Friday" in Romance Languages and *Karfreitag* (Sorrowful Friday) in German.

Regardless of its origins we as Christians live with the belief that resurrection happens - we are an Easter people and we worship the God of the second chance (or third or fourth). Perhaps it is for this reason why Good Friday can truly be good for us. Without it there would be no Easter! *Peace, Debi*

**Mind the Gap – Stewardship 2018**

Greetings – thanks to everyone who has submitted a pledge for the 2018 MCC Stewardship campaign. We currently have 91 pledges for a total of \$190,208. But there's a gap. While we have made great progress, we are still \$10,000 short of our goal of \$200,000, which is what was assumed in the 2018 budget. If we don't hit this goal, that means we'll have to pull more funds from our investment reserves to fund our operating costs.

**What is Tres Dias?** Tres Dias is an adult weekend that aims to concentrate closely on the person of Jesus Christ and His teachings. While Tres Dias explores basic Christian beliefs, it is best described as a spiritual encounter with Jesus Christ. Many who have attended a weekend have experienced a deeper and more meaningful relationship with Christ as they sense His love in a dynamic way.

**What is our purpose?** The mission of Tres Dias is to build and strengthen leaders for Christ; and to empower them to become leaders within their families, their small groups, their churches, and their communities. Tres Dias is an inter-denominational weekend encounter with Jesus Christ. Some may want to call it a retreat, but it does not have the solitude of a retreat. The focus of the weekend is "God's unmerited love." The weekend is designed to

show the "agape" type love that God pours out on us. This is love that is unconditional, unmerited, and for which the only true response can be love in return.

**Design of the Weekend**

The weekend runs from Thursday evening through Sunday afternoon. Those that attend a weekend are called pilgrims. In addition to other pilgrims, the weekend consists of committed Christian volunteers who serve as team members. They will attempt to share "Christ within them" with the pilgrims, while expecting nothing in return.

**During the weekend you can expect:**

- Group discussion of topics that are of vital interest to the body of Christ
- Times of prayer, sharing and fellowship
- Lots of music and singing
- Lots of fun!
- Lots of good food
- Most importantly, you can expect that God will meet you exactly where you are
