### **Money and Mammon**



The Bible calls the allure of wealth "mammon" (Matthew 6:24). This is what money becomes when treated as the bottom-line of what counts. Often forgotten is that money becomes just this not only when taken too seriously but when not taken seriously enough. Then, sooner or later, the need for money and the role it unavoidably plays in life acquire urgent and disproportionate influence. Ask anyone deeply in debt!

Sometimes around the church one gets the idea that money is not a spiritual matter, not an essential concern of faith, and an important emphasis in church life. "If I start hearing talk about money in church, I'm leaving." When this attitude prevails and talk of giving and financial commitment is low-keyed, far from becoming less of an issue, money becomes more of one. No money means no church, no mission – and weak faith. Giving is central to faith and the whole experience of living close to God. It's a matter of where we place our reliance and find our security.

This is clear in over half of Jesus' teaching and in the personal experience of his followers. From the first, they had to reconcile their commitment to him with the loss of security on which they had depended. Ultimately they found joy and "security" beyond measure.

"Make service your first priority, not success, and success will follow" (Robert Greenleaf). What's true of business is also true of the church's business when we follow the way of Jesus. "Strive first for the kingdom of God and all else follows" (Matthew 6:33). While this is no promise of having all we want, it's a promise of having all we need, as it turns out, what we really want after all!

What priorities are reflected in the way I spend and give?

How does my faith speak to my concerns about money?

These are questions my husband and I ask this time of year when each of our churches has their pledge drive. Wayne and I are in a unique situation where we each belong to a different church so we divide our pledges according to each of our incomes giving 10% of my income to MCC and 10% of his income to Woodmont United Church of Christ. Financially giving to our churches is one of our foundations for living.

I hope you all will prayerfully consider your love for MCC when deciding your pledges for 2019 and know that God will take care of the rest!

# Calm and Bright: 200 Years of Silent Night = Advent is Coming!



December 30, 10 am

The classic hymn, "Silent Night," made its debut 200 years ago on Christmas Eve, 1818 at the St. Nicholas chapel in Oberndorf bei Salzburg, Austria. The melody by composer Franz Gruber is instantly recognizable from the first few notes. The original text by Joseph Mohr has been translated from the original German into over 140 languages.

In 1914, just four years shy of the 100th anniversary of "Silent Night," soldiers fighting World War I along the Western Front held a ceasefire out of mutual respect for the holiday. They exchanged gifts and stories with one another, played games, and sang

carols together, including the beloved hymn "Silent Night." Today, churches all over the world gather together on Christmas Eve to light candles, sing "Silent Night," and participate in a timeless tradition of story and song.

Sometimes it feels as if our communities, churches and world are torn and divided about so many issues. This may cause us to feel that hope, peace, love, and joy are in short supply. This Advent, we are declaring a ceasefire from our own sources of conflict. Instead, we will raise our voices in song to celebrate the birth of Christ with spirits of peace and love that transcends all barriers. We hope that you and yours are able to join us for these special events in our lives together:

#### **Deacon Flocks**


